- Carry your car keys wherever you go-never leave them in the ignition, even if you leave for a only a few seconds.
- Sit inside your car while it de-icesnever let it de-ice unattended.
- Lock and secure your vehicle when exiting it.
- Keep valuables locked inside the trunk and out of sight, or bring them with you.
- Store important car documents and a spare key in your home or officeleaving them inside the car makes it easier for thieves to quickly sell your vehicle.
- Park in busy, well-lit areas near surveillance cameras.
- Use a garage to store your car.
